IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR AGAIN

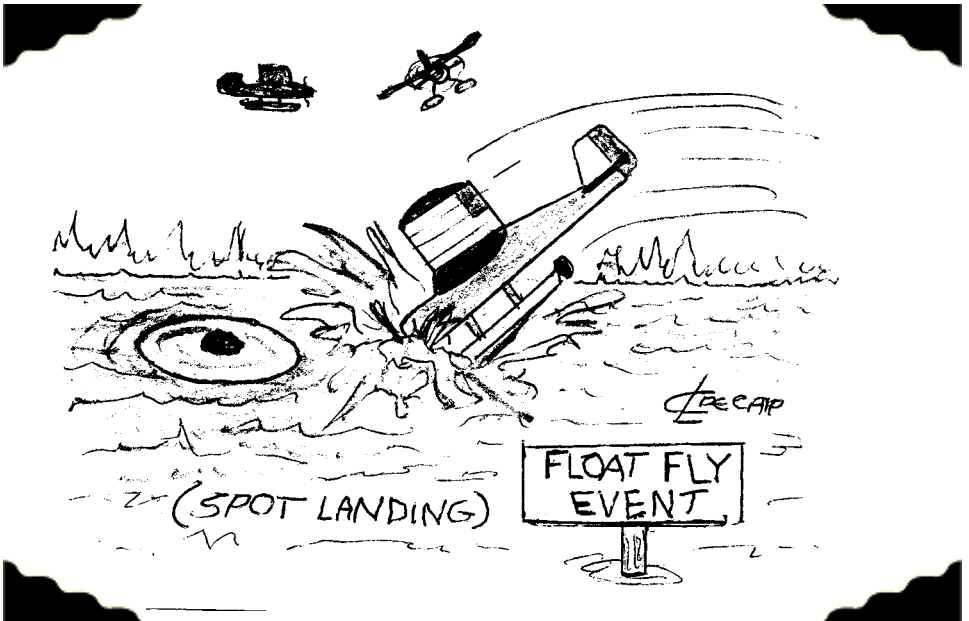
