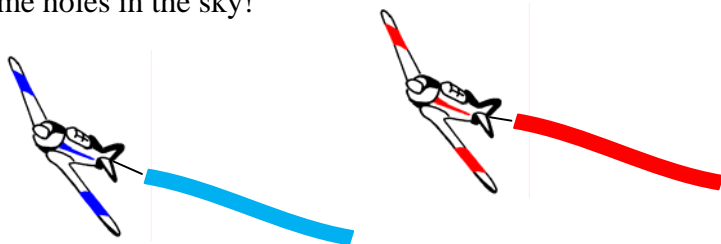


**For Sale**
